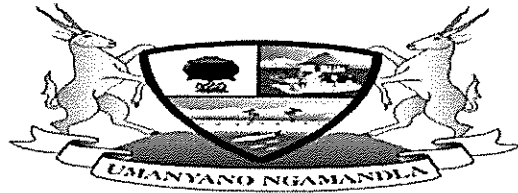

Terms of Reference For Environmental Threatening Obstacles in Mbizana Local Municipality

Service Providers are hereby invited to submit a proposal for attending to emergency environmental threatening obstacles within Mbizana CBD and along R61.

NB Note there should be a briefing session

1. Background

According to Section 24 of the South African Constitution everyone has the right to:

- an environment which is not harmful to their health or well-being
- have the environment protected for the benefit of present and future generations through reasonable legislative and other measures that:
 - prevent pollution and ecological degradation
 - promote conservation
 - Secure ecologically sustainable development and use of natural resources, while promoting justifiable economic and social development.

Emergency management is the coordination of an emergency response, the aim of emergency management is to minimize physical and psychological impacts i.e. minimize damage to assets, operations etc.

2. Purpose

The purpose of developing this document is to provide the Mbizana Local Municipality with a service provider that will assist in dealing with all environmental threatening obstacles within Mbizana CBD and entire R61.

3. Aims & Objectives

- To ensure that the entire public of Mbizana is not exposed to harmful environment as per NEMA.
- To prepare for an effective management of emergency situations and critical incidents and assist in minimizing the negative impacts of unexpected event.
- To prevent disasters of fires due to disturbances of power lines by trees
- To reduce risks in degradation of soil, pollution of air and water to the greatest extent possible.
- To prepare for potential dangerous situation in order to protect both human life and the environment.



- To reduce the frequency and consequences of uncontrolled, unplanned or accidental death of animals into the environment.
- To prevent immediate or long-term harmful effect on the environment or its biological diversity.
- To limit danger to the environment on which human life depends.

4. Identified Environmental Threatening obstacles will include the following:

- Trees which falls on the pavement which obstruct traffic and free movement of pedestrians.
- Trees which falls on power lines and on buildings.
- Stray animals which obstruct traffic.
- Knocked off domestic animals on R61 road.
- Wild animals that encroach residential areas and communities.
- Venomous snakes in residential areas and communities.
- Marine species which are dead and are deposited outside and have bad smelling.
- Medical waste on pavement and on waste bins
- Rubble and illegally dumped waste on public spaces.
- Uncollected waste due to unavailability of municipal truck/s.

5. Scope of Work

- Attend to reported incidents
- Site investigations on reported incidents
- Draft incident reports with POE's as proof of attended the incident
- Liase with responsible authorities and agencies, i.e. SPCA
- Collect and dispose any of the above mentioned environmental threatening obstacles on the road within the jurisdiction of the municipality using permissible equipment.

6. Requirements of service provider

The service provider must have the following but not be limited to them:

- Have their own transport
- Acquired Chemical Spill training
- Acquired tree felling training
- Own or be able to access towing services.

7. Duration of the project

The duration of the project will be 12 months.

8. Reporting

Incident shall be reported by community members to the Community Services Department, recorded on the complaints register, Service provider will be notified in writing and on completion the service provider will be required to submit an incident report with the invoice on monthly basis.




9. Pricing

Pricing will vary on the basis of each reported incident; however the service provider is required to include the following pricing in the proposal.


